>> What is "America's Musical Journey"? Why is Aloe Blacc mentioned?

"America's Musical Journey" is a documentary about the musical <u>heritage</u> of America.

Aloe Blacc, a <u>famous</u> American singer-songwriter and rapper, is the <u>host</u> who takes us on this journey across the country, stopping at the big American cities where different music styles were born.

The <u>track</u> we can hear is the song "Wake Me Up" that he is famous <u>for</u> sing<u>ing</u>, and which is Avicii's 2013 single. >> What do you learn about the history of American music?

Music in America is <u>deeply linked to</u> its history as a land of immigration. Indeed, the collision of different cultures* and languages <u>triggered</u> / <u>sparked</u> the birth of different musical genres and styles. (* the cultures <u>collided</u>) >> What is the goal of the document?

>>>The film <u>aims at exploring</u> the musical heritage of the USA's great cities.

>>> The <u>goal of</u> its trailer <u>is to:</u>

- <u>talk</u> people <u>into</u> going to see the movie
- <u>convince</u> people <u>to go</u> see the movie
- make people see the movie

>> What is the tone of the speaker?

The tone <u>throughout</u> the trailer is *both* <u>passionate</u> *and* <u>enthusiastic</u>.

The <u>use</u> of verbs such as "spark" or "ignite", and adjectives <u>such as</u> "foot-stomping" or "trailblazing", <u>reinforce</u> this effect.
